

# Successful Investments in the National Trails System



In 2024, the National Scenic and Historic Trail nonprofit partners leveraged Federal investment to raise and invest **\$44,123,210** 





Since 1995, the National Scenic and Historic Trail nonprofit partners have leveraged federal investment to raise and invest \$801,346,401. The elimination of the NSHT line item budget will be detrimental to future efforts to raise and invest money in the National Trails System.



## What's At Risk?

- The National Park Service will face a \$900 million funding cut to National Park Service Operations
- BLM funding for National Trails reduced to \$0 from \$11 million overall 74% cut to national Monuments, National Conservation Areas, Wilderness and Wilderness Study Areas, Wild and Scenic Rivers, and National Scenic and Historic Trails
- The Forest Service will face trail funding cuts of 60% for maintenance
- Drastically reducing critical Land and Water Conservation Funds promised to the American people that are essential for protecting and completing the national trails system

### What Does This Mean?

These cuts will lead to

- Increased staffing cuts at our already under-staffed land management agencies
- Limited agency resources and increased roadblocks for nonprofit partners to effectively build, maintain, and interpret the trails
- Delays for critical maintenance projects that will increase the deferred maintenance backlog
- Negatively impacting the American public's visitor experience and recreational enjoyment of trails
